

A Resolution to Replace the Single Vote Per Person in Presidential Primary Elections (L16)

1 **WHEREAS,** Current U.S. primary elections allow for one vote per voter to go to a
2 single candidate; and

3 **WHEREAS,** A large field of various candidates may be campaigning in a primary
4 election; and

5 **WHEREAS,** The current system prevents voters from displaying who the least
6 reasonable candidate may be; and

7 **WHEREAS,** Political campaigns that are rancorous and hostile are not checked under
8 the current system; now, therefore, be it

9 **RESOLVED,** That the Congress here assembled recommend that state legislatures
10 organizing Presidential primaries adopt the ranked-choice voting system.
